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Therapeutic Uses Of *Sitopaladi Choorna* - An Experimental View

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ABSTRACT

Choorna preparations are commonly used by physicians all over the India and Indian subcontinent. *Ajamodadi choorna, Ashwagandhadi choorna, Avipattikara choorna, Dadimashtaka choorna, Madhumehari choorna, Gangadhara choorna, Pushyanuga choorna, Triphala choorna, Panchasakara choorna, Shatsakara choorna, Trikatu choorna, Brahmi choorna, Arjuna choorna, Ashoka choorna and Yashtimadhu choorna* are few choorna preparation which are popularly used in the treatment of various disorders. *Sitopaladi choorna* is one such medicine which is used in the management of Respiratory disorders. *Pratishyaya, Pinasa, Gala shotha,* Pharyngitis, Laryngitis, Tracheitis, Bronchitis, Bronchial asthma, COPD, Bronchiectasis and Emphysema, are the disorders in which *Sitopaladi choorna* gives good outcome. The ingredients of this formulation are having the actions like, *Dipana, Pachana, Digestive, Kasahara, Shwasahara,* Anti allergic, Expectorant, Mucolytic, Bronchodilator, *Vatakapha hara, Ushna, Vatanulomana, Ruchikara,* Anti infection, Anti-bacterial, Bactericidal and *Rasayana* actions.

Present paper highlights about the therapeutic uses of Sitopaladi choorna in an experimental view.

Sitopaladi choorna is commonly used in management of Respiratory disorders. The ingredients like, *Pippali, Lavanga, Twak, Ela* etc., are *Dipana, Pachana, Ushna guna yukta, Kasahara, Shwasahara* and Mucolytic actions. As *sitopaladi choorna* contains *Sita* (Cane Sugar), it is palatable for children also. Because of *Katurasa* and *Ushna guna*, it decreases secretion in bronchioles and gives relief from Dyspnoea.

AIM AND OBJECTIVES

To study the therapeutic uses of *Stiopaladi choorna* in scientific and experimental view.

The related subject matter is compiled from Research monographs, scientific journals, contemporary literature *Sangraha granthas*, *Samhita granthas*, and from personal clinical experience.

- 1. Sharkara or Sitopala (Sugar candy) 16 P
- 2. Vamshalochana (Bamboo Marina) 8 P
- 3. *Pippali* (Long pepper) 4 P
- 4. Ela (Cardamom) 2 P

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5. Twak (Cinnamon bark) - 1 P

Preparation

All ingredients are powdered separately, sieved, mixed and stored.

DISCUSSION

Sitopaladi choorna is commonly used in the management of Upper and Lower respiratory disorders. 13. Pippali, Twak and Ela are Katurasa yukta, Ushna virya, and Dipana, Pachana in actions. Sitopala is Madhura rasa yukta, Balya, Brimhana, Raktapittahara, Ojaskara and Jivaniya in action. 14. Sitopaladi choorna is usually given along with honey. Even in small children, it becomes palatable when given along with honey. Even in acute disorders like Pneumonia, Pulmonary edema and Acute conditions of Pulmonary Koch's, it is given as an add on therapy with modern medications. In upper respiratory diseases, as it acts an Ushnavirya yukta, it decreases the congestion in nose, irritation in throat, Kapha in Gala and Shwasa nali, kasa and reduces secretion in respiratory tract 15.. As it contains Dipana, Panchana drugs, it can be given in Ajirna and Agnimandya also. However in Pulmonary Koch's, Proper AKT must be given and Sitopaladi choorna is given as add on therapy.

CONCLUSION

- 1. Sitopaladi choorna is effective in various Respiratory disorders.
- 2. With suitable disease specific adjustments, if it is given, it showed desired results.
- 3. When it is given as add on therapy (E.g.: In Pneumonia and Pulmonary edema patients), it acts supportive to the main modern management.

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
